WINED & DINED

The sun is shining and though my infant strawberry plants are just beginning to flower I can almost

taste the sweet, aromatic fruits that will follow. With the onset of summer comes a heightening of the senses – a change in atmosphere; everything takes on new depth and colour. Blue skies and the full-bodied warmth of the summer sun release the voluptuous aroma of springs blossoms

and summer fruits, evoking thoughts of lazy summer days, salt sea air carried on coastal breezes, succulent strawberries dipped in champagne which intoxicate the senses, sunripened peaches with rose-tinted skins plucked straight from the

tree and eaten whilst still warm; a sense of holiday; beach barbecues crisp salads and the salty stickiness of char-grilled meat and fish. Be it from garden, field or sea, the warm summer earth offers up a rich diversity of sun-kissed edible pleasures which are with us for the most transient of moments. The British strawberry in particular seems to carry the very essence of summertime, and its flavour must be captured and enjoyed during its short lived seasonal reign. Strawberries that have been frozen or tinned will never captivate the senses in the same way as a fresh sun-drenched summer strawberry can; strawberry conserves carry the imprint of glorious summer days as does homemade strawberry syrup made with the juiciest seasonal fruits . I make bottles of the stuff during strawberry season and feel

quite bereft if we run out before the next season begins.

The short-lived nature of seasonal summer foods bestows upon them a potency, a vibrancy that seems to signify life, health and a sensuality exclusive to summer foods at their peak. Sweet and tender young garden peas eaten straight from the pod, the golden flesh of a sweet scented peach, and tightly budded asparagus tips dripping with butter. Summer food is all about

simplicity, about making the most of rising temperatures, slowing down the pace and savouring the intensity of flavour developed during weeks spent basking in the blazing summer sun. To my mind nothing beats the experience of enjoying a native, seasonal fruit

or vegetable straight from the plant, such as a Florida orange which almost drowns you when you bite into it, having been filled to capacity by the sun during the growing period.

One of my most memorable meals was taken in Portugal on the Algarve in a little restaurant overlooking the sea. This meal consisted of a platter of various fruits and cheeses, warm olive bread, olive butter, garlic butter, olives and fresh walnuts. The walnuts tasted like ripe fruits rather than the dry and slightly flaky nuts we know over here, and the fruits and olives were bursting with fresh flavour. We washed the whole thing down with a crisp white wine and this simple meal tasted like the food of the Gods.

Dare I mention that summer seems to have arrived early this year, let's make the most of it.



There's a ghostly presence at the Parsonage – the echoes of Charlotte Brontë's voice can be heard in the Dining Room. It's not a real supernatural occurrence of course, but the results of a project we've been working on with artist Catherine Bertola.

Catherine's work brings forgotten history back to life, for example recreating historic wallpaper patterns in dust on the floor of derelict buildings, or making traditional lace patterns of her own underwear. Because the museum wages war against dust on a daily basis, and the Brontes' underwear is far from lacy, she decided on a very different approach for the Parsonage. Inspired by a 1960s sound experiment. Catherine has 'captured' the sound of the Dining Room. She recorded herself reading aloud extracts from Charlotte Bronte's letters into the room, then played this recording back into the space, recording this in turn and repeating the process again and again, until the sound of her voice fades and the room begins to sing. This is the unique resonance of the room, and it makes a strange musical sound, a bit like wind chimes or whale song. You can hear this playing intermittently in the Dining Room, like a ghost or memory

of the house as it once was. Catherine spent hours making the recordings, and because she needed complete silence, we realised how noisy the house is today, even before or after closing time, competing with the vacuum cleaner and creaky floorboards, hourly clock chimes, a bleeping credit card machine and once, when we thought we'd exhausted every other possible noise, a hooting owl in the trees outside. Alongside the sound piece. Catherine took three photographs of herself 'performing' some of the domestic rituals of the house, to bring a sense of ghostly movement back to the rooms. Here she is circling the Dining Room table, as the Bronte sisters did every evening, and although it looks like the movement is swift. Catherine had to creep around the table incredibly slowly, pausing at certain points to create the three figures. The images remind us of a photograph taken years ago at the front door of the Parsonage. The house was empty when the picture was taken, but when it was developed (pre-digital days!), there was the definite shape of a grey crinolined figure just inside the front door. So although art and science is behind the current ghostly goings-on, there are still some mysteries here that are harder to solve...



I this talk of the 1940s and royal weddings got me to wondering about what delicacies guests at the big wedding of 1947 were served. When the Queen. then the Princess Elizabeth, married Prince Philip, in November 1947, it turns out the menu was Filet de Sole Mountbatten: Perdreau en Casserole. Haricots Verts, Pommes Noisette and Salade Royale: Bombe Glacee Princesse Elizabeth; Friandises; Dessert. This broadly translates as a fish starter followed by partridge stew, green beans and mash, a salad (why?), and then ice cream for pud. You may be pleased to know that this failed to inspire me to any recipe at all this month, so I looked closer to my more humble Yorkshire roots and came up with a stunning way of using a glut of rhubarb which could not help but impress any passing royal, should you really need to do

1 packet ainaernuts 1 packet plain, buttery biscuit (like Foxes crumble ones)

100a butter

Mash up the biscuits to crumbs, melt the butter, mix well together and press into a 9 inch baking tin (or something broadly similar).

8-10 sticks of rhubarb, trimmed and washed 100g of sugar (or less depending on how sweet you like your rhubarb)

a little water

4 sheets of gelatine, soaked in cold water

Chop the rhubarb, and simmer gently in a pan with the about half of the sugar and water (enough to come about half way up the rhubarb). Cook for 5 mins and taste to see if it is sweet enough for you, and add more sugar if needed, Simmer until soft and falling apart. Drain most of the juice off into a cup for later. Add the soaked gelatine to the hot rhubarb and stir well until dissolved.

300a philadelphia cheese 200a white chocolate 300 ml tub of double cream

Melt the chocolate very gently in the microwave with a tablespoon of the cream , stirring after each 30 seconds until melted. Whip the cream until just starting to thicken, then stir in the creamcheese. Mix the chocolate into the cream mix and whip together until smooth and light. Gently swirl the rhubarb and gelatine mix into the cream, and spoon onto the biscuit base. Chill for an hour or two before enjoying with a drizzle of the reserved rhubarb juice. Now&Then

An exhibition of artworks by British
American artist and Haworth resident,
Judy Sale, will be opened on Saturday,
7 May, 2011, at 3:30pm by the Right
Worshipful the Lord Mayor, Cllr. Peter Hill
and the Lady Mayoress, Mrs Gillian Hill, of
Bradford.

The exhibition is called 'Now & Then' with 'Now' in reference to Haworth today and 'Then' in reference to the more famous past when the artistic Bronte family lived in Haworth. The exhibition was first shown in a 'street exhibition' up and down Main St. during the Haworth Arts Festival last September. This was before the recent restoration of the original two 18th century weavers' cottages at 49-51 Main St. was completed. The house is now restored and is the home, studio and private art gallery for Judy. It is both remarkable and fitting that the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress should cut the ribbon for this inaugural exhibition at this property because it was discovered that the Lord Mayor and the Lady Mayoress have also resided in this same historical house on Main St. some years ago!

Judy is an acclaimed professional abstract painter who has works in several reputable public and private collections in various parts of the world having lived and worked in 8 different countries and traveled to many more. She came to Haworth first as a guest of friends already residing on Haworth's Main St. who introduced the idea that Haworth might make a good home and place to work for her as well. Judy was living in Italy at the time but had decided that she wished to return to England where she had lived previously.



It is hoped that this exhibition will show how Haworth is the perfect environment for all creative people who appreciate the magic of this area and are seeking the freedom and friendship offered by the multi-cultured residents. Because of its famous historical past connection to the Bronte family however, Haworth is often associated solely with the past while the present and future are overlooked. The purpose of this exhibition is to explore Haworth both 'Now and Then' to show that Haworth's creative past must continue to be a reference for modern creative people today.

All works of art at this exhibition will be for sale with the proceeds being shared with the Haworth Village Association working for a better working community. Anyone wishing to find out more about the artist's work, should visit the artists website: www.judysale.com



Deborah Steel, Jennifer Steel, Ian Barron and Antonio Capozio from Haworth have planned an adventure to Peru in August this year. The friends have always wanted to visit South America and especially Peru, so they decided to book a 3 week excursion to include the Amazon rainforest and the ancient Inca ruins of Machu Picchu.

It was Debbie and Jenny's mum who mentioned that Haworth was twinned with Machu Picchu. This inspired the girls to contact Rita Verity from the Haworth Twinning group to see if there was anything the friends could do to help



with establishing closer links or perhaps utilise their skills and abilities whilst out in Peru. Further contacts were made and eventually the 'Trek for Specs' project was created.

Debbie is a Specialist Orthoptist (an eye care professional) at Bradford Royal Infirmary, Jenny is an Optometrist at Boots Opticians Keighley, Ian is a Chef at The Grouse Inn Oldfield and Antonio is a Dispensing Optician at Brosgill Opticians

Ilkley. With three out of the four having a broad knowledge base in optical care it was decided that an eyecare related expedition seemed logical.

The Haworth Twinning group put them in touch with Leander Hollings and the charity MySmallHelp. (To read more about MySmallHelp and the work in Peru please visit www.mysmallhelp.org/support_disable_person_in_peru)

The four members of the 'Trek for Specs' team are collecting donated adult and children's glasses and taking them to the communities around Ollantytambo, Peru. They aim to assess people for their specific need for glasses and match their requiremnt to the donated supply. If there is not a suitable match available then the funds raised will go towards purchasing suitable glasses for those most in need. The 'Trek' that the team will be making is the 4 day Inca Trail finishing in Machu Picchu. It is a difficult 26 mile camping trek with long ascents and steep downhill

sections of Inca steps. Combined with high altitude passes of 4200m and rapidly changing weather conditions they expect a tough challenge.

Every penny raised will go to the charity, MySmallHelp. The whole trip is completely self-funded as any summer holiday would be; the difference is that they have chosen to dedicate some of their time to a worthy cause. Debbie, Jenny, lan and Antonio are not asking for money towards their trek, flights or accommodation. They are simply asking that if people would like to support the charitable work then please make a donation. This can be in the form of a few pounds or a pair of old spectacles, either would be much appreciated!







CLEARING THE AIRE AND WORTH VALLEYS OF COMPUTER-BASED CONFUSION

Experiencing problems with your computer that aren't serious enough to warrant calling for the services of a support engineer, but which, nonetheless, irritate you to the point of insanity? If so, you're not alone.

Whilst we wait for your queries to start filling our inbox, here's a super query raised by a visitor to the first De-Mystify Me Drop-in Surgery sessions last month...

- Q. I make long journeys and like to listen to music en route. In my new car there's no multi-disk changer, but the CD player can read MP3 disks. I've been advised to convert my normal audio CDs to MP3 format and then burn all the tracks off several CDs onto a single recordable CD. I know I need to use my PC for this, but what does 'ripping and burning' mean? Where do I start?
- A. First you copy the contents of your audio CDs to your computer and convert the music to compressed files ('ripping'). You then choose the music tracks you want from a list on your PC and these files then aet written ('burned' by the CD drive's laser, not a blow-torch!) to a recordable CD. There are many different software products available on the market for doing this. Exact steps vary from product to product, and we don't know what software vou've got, so it's hard to provide specific instructions for your PC. Here's some

general tips that should help you on your

- I. Check your computer has a CD or DVD writer installed - look at the symbols on the front of the CD drive. It's no good ripping the CDs, if the drive isn't a burner (writer or re-writer)!
- 2. Check what software you've got. Most Windows PCs have media playing software built-into the operating system. Look out for 'Windows Media Player' on yours to start with -it's ideal for ripping and basic CD burning. If you haven't got this, then try downloading it from Microsoft's website. Some 'third party' CD/DVD burning products e.g. Nero or Roxio Creator have extra functionality. Better to save the clever stuff for later though!
- 3. Most software has a Help function, so use it to search for what you want to do e.g. 'convert to mp3' or 'create a CD' etc. You'll be directed to product-specific step-bystep instructions. Open your media player software and start 'Help' (press the F1 key/select 'Help' from the menu bar/ click on .
- 4. The higher the 'bit rate' you set the software to use during the 'ripping' the better the sound quality, but the more space each track will take up on your computer (and the recordable CD). Some products allow you to convert music files to other formats or reduce the bit rate after ripping to squeeze more tracks on a CD; others won't, so experiment! If you find it difficult to explain your query in writing come and show us instead at our Drop-in Surgeries. 
