Please don't put it off any longer

Sutton United FC

Sutton Forest FC, formed around 1902, was the first club in the village, later changing its name to Sutton FC. By 1904 however, the name of Sutton United had emerged, and it was this side that became a force in league football for almost half a century. In its early days, the club was closely associated with Sutton Baptist Church, one of the conditions of membership of the football team being attendance at the chapel or Sunday School.

By 1906, the side were the first ever Keighley League champions, and n 1907 it became first and only local side to lift the Airedale & Wharfedale cup. More success followed, winning the Keighley Charity Cup in both 1908 & 1909, and also the first ever Keighley & District FA Cup in 1909.

Between the Wars, United won the Charity Cup in 1925 and 1928, and the District Cup in 1927 and 1931 and 1939, winning it also three times in succession after World War two between 1947-49. The team also won the Keighley League title again in 1914.

Seeking a higher grade of competition, United, along with Silsden and Keighley Celtic defected to the Bradford & District league in the summer of 1909. It was not a successful move, so United dropped back into the Keighley League the following year.

Sutton United was reformed after the Great War, adopting the same red and white stripes

of their predecessors. There was a new ground behind the village church, previously used by Sutton Forest club. And were being prime movers in the formation of the new South Craven League in 1922. The club won that league in 1925 and 1929, before the winning the Airedale & Craven League in 1933. Less success was achieved when the club moved on to the Bradford and West Riding Leagues, however. 1923 saw another ground move, this time sharing playing surfaces with Kildwick Parish cricket club on Holme Lane. Times were hard, with the country enduring the onset of war, the club went into hibernation during the summer of 1939, not re-emerging until 1946, winning the Craven League title in its first season back Re-entry into the Bradford League in 1953 in proved to be the beginning of a rapid slide into oblivion as Sutton United resigned from the competition in October 1953, reporting a shortage of players. The reserve team that operated in the Keighley League - itself now a shadow of its former self - was now the first team for the rest of the season. The following season saw a Sutton Textiles side operating in the Keighley League, with United fielding a side in the Keighley Minor league only, before United name returned to senior football for one final season. The team's swansong was a 2-6 loss to Worth Village in the League Cup final, after which, in the summer of 1956, Sutton United slipped quietly from the scene. ~ Rob Grillo

WELCOME BACK TO THE BRONTË PARSONAGE MUSEUM

We were delighted to throw open the doors of the Parsonage once more on Friday 28 August and welcome back our first visitors. Being able to do so was the result of weeks of intensive work: poring over Government guidelines and risk assessments; commissioning and installing protective screens, hand sanitising stations and new signage; implementing online booking and timed ticketing and then sharing all of this with our staff and volunteers through a series of training days.

So what can you expect when you visit? Some things have changed, but other things, such as a warm welcome and informative and inspiring displays, haven't. **The biggest change is that admission is now by pre-booked timed ticket only – even for those who live nearby!** Those of you familiar with the Museum will know that it is an intimate, historic

building with our collections displayed in a number of small rooms. It's therefore very important that we control numbers and facilitate social distancing. Our online booking system also supports the NHS Test and Trace service by collecting the names and details of visitors. Booking is via the Visit Us page of our website. You will be directed to Art Tickets and will be asked to select a date and time and type of ticket. **If you still have a Aire Valley Mag 'Let me in, I'm local!' voucher to redeem,**

you will find these in the Free and Promotional Tickets list. Your

ticket is then emailed to you and you can print it out before your visit or download it to a mobile device.

Our staff are all wearing visors or facemasks and visitors are also required to wear face coverings. We have set up a one-way route through the museum and surfaces are cleaned at regular intervals during the day.

Museum is and screens have been installed at the cash desk and in the shop. Contactless payments are preferred, but we will accept cash where this is not possible.

Sarah Goodenough was one of our first visitors of our reopening weekend and shared this with us:

"It was so good to be back at the Museum. I felt very welcomed and safe and the museum staff did a wonderful

job of making me feel at ease. I felt like I had the Parsonage to myself due to the small groups allowed in at allocated times. Thank you to everyone involved for making the experience truly great despite such difficult times."

Golden Autumnal Hues by Lee Senior

Autumn arrives in our gardens this month and with it comes one of nature's finest displays.Very little in nature can beat this grand finale of stunning, fiery leaf colour just before the trees shed their foliage for winter.

The fallen, spent leaves are great for making leaf mould too. This very useful soil improver is created by simply gathering fallen deciduous leaves and leaving them for a year to rot down. They can be put in bags or simply left out in the open. Don't be tempted to add the leaves to a compost bin as they rot down much slower than normal garden material.

The so-called dormant period between now and the end of March is the ideal time to plant bare-rooted trees or fruit bushes. The advantage of trees in containers is they can be planted all year round. If you

are ordering by mail order it is important to unpack the trees straight away as they will have very little fibrous root. Give them a good soak before planting them in their final positions.

Overwintered Onion sets and garlic can be planted this month. Garlic enjoys rather cold winter weather and the longer growing season given by Autumn planting. October and November are the busiest months of the year for bulb planting. No matter what the size of your garden there is a vast choice of both dwarf and larger daffodil varieties. Dwarf types will even grow in a deep window box, along with a smattering of crocus and snowdrops. Indoors, specially prepared or 'forced' hyacinth bulbs can be planted now in a bowl for flowering in December. The heady scents of these fine bulbs are sure to brighten any room during the darker months.

The 'forced' bulbs have been heat treated to flower earlier than garden hyacinths which flower outdoors in April. To get a good root system it is a good idea to let the bulbs spend the first couple of weeks in the dark. Once roots form, they need a cool, well- light room or a frost-free



unheated greenhouse. After flowering the bulbs can be planted out in the garden and should flower outdoors in future years. Finally, why not plant out a few winter bedding plants in key areas. Favourites such as polyanthus, primroses

and winter flowering pansies will not fail to disappoint. They will flower throughout the milder spells of winter and early next spring. Something we can all look forward to!
