








BAHAMAS BREEZE TO CARLISLE




Whilst some might sit back and relax after the 50th Anniversary celebrations last year, not us! We have just helped the Bahamas Locomotive Society re-launch their centre-piece locomotive, named "Bahamas", back into mainline service after a 25 year absence and with the help of a significant Heritage Lottery Fund grant. We ran two sell-out services from Oxenhope all the way to Carlisle. The inaugural run was on 9th February, which you might recall was a very stormy day. I nervously drove to Oxenhope from Settle in the morning to join the train for the on-time 8.15am departure, but had to pick my way through fallen trees and debris blown into the road. It. wasn't entirely surprising, but was very disappointing, to hear that a tree had fallen onto the overhead wires at Steeton, so we were held at Keighley because of the obstruction. What is typical of our "can do" attitude and well-trained volunteers is that we were able to help Network Rail clear the tree and therefore helped re-open the Airedale for the usual service trains that had begun stacking-up when the line was closed. So only around 20 minutes late, we made our way to Skipton, then on to a water stop at Hellifield and another at Appleby, before steaming into Carlisle only a handful of minutes behind schedule thanks the magnificent performance of

"Bahamas". The only disappointment I heard on board from passengers was that one partner hadn't fully understood what they were being treated to when the name "Bahamas" as mentioned. With sleet and hail falling, and the dark night closing in as we returned, we were a long way from the Caribbean cruise that they might have been expecting, but it was a great experience nonetheless!

We ran the second excursion the following weekend, and the weather could not have been more of a contrast, with a beautiful clear blue winter sky overhead, the photographers out in force had a field day. Whilst many camera lenses and wellwishers all across the Settle & Carlisle line might have been focused on Bahamas' exploits, we continued to run a full service on the branch line, as we do every weekend and school holidays through the year. We are now turning our attention to our Spring steam gala (8-10th March), when visitors will be able to enjoy Bahamas hauling trains as well as visiting locomotives and special double-headed and demonstration freight services.

It won't be long until our programme of Haworth Haddock (fish & chip supper) specials recommence, with the first on April 27th; and new for this year is our Prosecco-tasting "Sparkle & Steam" (the first on 1st March) and "Scotch Flyer" (23rd March) whisky-tasting services. Of course, we continue with our usual programme of "Footplate Experience" and hosting Brontë Ban's "Gin Express" trains. With so much to see and do, I hope that you will join us on board soon, as we embark on the journey of the second half-century of Railway preservation.



This is a tale of two buildings off Lawkholme Lane in Keighley. One is Keighley Drill Hall home since 1867 of local volunteers for the British armed forces. When it was opened at the height of the Victorian era, Britain ruled the waves and gunboats were despatched to all corners of the globe. Today young men and women still embark on careers in our armed forces from this hall and join perhaps the most professional military in the world. As the local MP I take no vote in the House of Commons more seriously than any which would commit them to action.

Twelve months before the opening of the drill hall, a few hundred yards up the same road, Keighley Rugby League Football Club started playing on a field. The next 150 years were full of ups and downs with the highlights being a Challenge Cup Final appearance in 1937 and Cougarmania when Keighley were the first club in England to bring razzmatazz to the sport. The club became part of the soul of the town which is why the recent news of a fresh start created such a sense of feel good.

My point is simply that over the last century and a half for Keighley and District, just as for our nation as a whole, so called 'soft power 'has become as important as military might. Premier League Football,

British music from the Beatles onwards and the BBC are known throughout the world. In the same way all our local sports teams, Cliffe Castle, East Riddlesden Hall, the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway and the Bronte Heritage are very much part of our own identity and attract people both to live in the area and visit it. Everything we can do to strengthen these assets is a priority for me.

Cougar Park and the neighbouring Keighley Cricket Club could become a new sporting hub eligible for grants from a variety of sporting bodies. In Haworth we urgently need a replacement advice centre to assist tourists to replace the recently closed facility. The fight must continue against the incinerator which would overshadow and diminish East Riddlesden Hall.

Finally, we must continue to reinvigorate Keighley's parks with more events like the recent innovation of a Park Run at Cliffe Castle. For inspiration we need look only over the moor to Halifax which has reinvented itself in the last few years.

Oxenhope resident, Diane Watts, recently hosted the launch of the new book, 'How to Become a World-Class Investigator' at Salts Mill, Saltaire.

The author, Julie Clegg, is the cyber crime

expert on the popular Channel 4 series, 'Hunted'. Julie is also an ambassador for the charity Embrace Child Victims of Crime. Diane is currently Embrace's Chief Fundraiser and Young Victims Care Officer for the North of the UK.

Diane and Julie have a history that goes back decades.

In 'How to Become a World Class Investigator,' Julie tells the story of her relationship with Diane and how their friendship was initially forged through very serious and harrowing events. Diane was a police officer in Bradford for thirty years and when she and Julie's paths crossed Julie was a victim of serious crime and only 17 years old.

In her book, Julie writes, in reference to Diane, "Her professionalism and kindness shattered all of the impressions I had of detectives up to that point, which I only knew from detective novels, where everyone was hard-nosed and typically male. She was the most inspiring person I had ever met...because of the positive way

she handled my case, and her incredible support afterward, I realised I wanted to spend my life helping people the

way Diane had helped me."

Five years later Julie became a police officer and found herself working alongside Diane. She writes, "First she was my role model, then she was my mentor, then she

was my peer."

Following her career in the Police, Julie moved to Canada and went on to specialise in the investigation of cyber crime. Her book provides the insight and instruction needed to become successful in the field.














To tie in with our celebration of Patrick Brontë this year, the Brontë Parsonage Museum is launching a community project to discover more about Haworth in the time of the Brontës and in doing so bring the history of Haworth to life. In last month's magazine, our Learning Officer Sue described how the decision to celebrate Patrick this year was one that we all felt enthusiastic about, but Patrick is not only the father of literary geniuses; he is indelibly linked with Haworth, having spent 41 years serving the parish, and so we want to take a closer look at Haworth this year. We all know that Patrick was a social campaigner who did much to improve sanitation in Haworth and thus transform the lives of his parishioners, but what do we know of the lives of these parishioners? During Patrick's ministry, from 1820 to 1861. Haworth witnessed fast growth and huge change. Our community project, 'A Strange land?': Haworth in the time of the Brontës', will allow us to discover more about the rapidly developing town served by Patrick, but particularly the people he would have encountered.

The project is open to all, so you can take part as an individual, a family, a school, a local business, a community group, Brownie or Cub! And the ways you can

old property you can research your house and its occupants; you can research your own family tree if your descendants are from Haworth; you can adopt a character or a business to research (the tithe map provides names of residents and their occupation, whilst the graveyard is also a useful source of local residents!); you can investigate what it was like to be a child in the time of the Brontës and think about how our attitudes about childhood have changed, not to mention living and working conditions. The list is endless. I look forward to learning more about Haworth's history, landscape and its inhabitants through uncovering the stories of Patrick's parishioners. There will be opportunities, as the project develops, to bring different groups together to share their stories, and hopefully we'll all learn a little more about each other along the way. I love this time of year. Spring is bursting through all over. The snowdrops have been replaced by daffodils and crocuses, the birds are singing, and the days are getting longer. One thing I'm not so keen on, however, is the way the sunlight streams into my house highlighting my mucky windows and all the dusting I haven't done over winter;...a mammoth cleaning frenzy ensues. My spring-cleaning session also includes the fridge which, strangely enough, is the inspiration for this recipe!

A quick and simple curry that is perfect for any vegetables that need using up. I added sugar snap and garden peas, potatoes, kale, cabbage and spinach but you really can add anything. It's tasty and packed with goodness.

Ingredients

I onion, roughly chopped 2 garlic clove

2 gai lic clove

4cm ginger, roughly chopped

I red chilli (optional), roughly chopped – remove the seeds if you don't like it hot Handful of coriander

15g coconut oil

2 tsp garam masala

2 tsp cumin

I tin chopped tomatoes

I-2 stock cube

60g cashews, toasted and finely blended

50g coconut cream 200g vegetables I cup of basmati rice Limes to serve METHOD

Add the garlic, ginger, chilli and coriander stalks to a food processor and mix until smooth, then leave to one side.

Melt the oil in a wok or large frying pan over a medium to high heat. Add the onion and fry for 4 minutes, stirring regularly. Sprinkle in the garam masala, cumin, the paste you made and fry for 3-4 minutes. Pour in the tinned tomatoes, stock cube and enough water to create a nice sauce, bring to the boil.

Add the green veg and simmer for a further 2 mins, or longer depending on how crunchy you like your veg and season with salt if necessary. Finally, stir in the blitzed cashew nuts and coconut milk, sprinkle over the chopped coriander leaves and serve with rice or naan bread and lime.




HIDDEN WONDERS


