

KEEP ROLLING

This time of year sees our valiant team of civil maintenance volunteers at the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway take 'possession' of the line and work their magic to replace, renew or repair the infrastructure that is vital to keep the wheels turning. We have increasingly challenging projects to tackle. This September we are addressing an issue that the Midland Railway first encountered over 100 years ago,

with a groundworks project to stabilise the embankment near Mytholmes Tunnel and next spring we will be replacing a bridge between Ingrow and Damems. Whilst we are usually able to avoid disruption to the weekend's services, both of these projects result in us having to run the Railway in two sections, with a vintage 'bus service connecting the two. It means that the heritage diesel has been shuttling between Oakworth and Keighley whilst a steam service runs between Haworth and Oxenhope. It's also given us an opportunity to operate one of the small diesels that is usually confined to shunting duties at Oxenhope so it's a very different operation than normal.

Whilst we keep the passengers conveyed, the maintenance volunteers are replacing trackwork at Damems junction as well as dealing with the embankment near Ebor Lane. Modern tools and techniques are used throughout, but we also make extensive use of more traditional methods and our very own steam-powered crane will come into play. Once the work is complete, we will revert to our more usual service, although it's only a couple of weeks until the **Beer** & Music Festival (I'm sure many or



the Civil Maintenance gang will be taking a break and reflecting on their achievements over a pint or two selected from the choice of over 100 that will be on offer during the event!) and then **Halloween specials**. Full details, including advance booking options, are all available on the website. I daren't finish before reminding you that it's not that long until Christmas. I know the reminder is far too soon for many of us, a number of **Santa** dates are already full and tickets sold even faster than last year when we opened the booking in July so please do consider being a little festive now to avoid any disappointment.

Finally, some sad news. With the Railway having been operated by the Society for over 50 years, it is inevitable that we have had to bid a very final 'right away' to many of the volunteers who have been a familiar sight on the Railway for several decades. Many of you will have travelled on the annual Carol Service and it's with great sadness that I learned than Canon Bruce Grainger passed away in September, quite suddenly and very peacefully. He had led the Carol train lessons and choir for over 30 years and my very best wishes to his direct as well as his wider church and choir families. Matt Stroh, Chairman

shadows of the Priory Ruins prepare for fire eaters, fairground rides and a spectacular firework display! Or for a sprinkle of magic how about



I've always been passionate about analogue photography and wanted to set up my own darkroom so when the opportunity came up to do just that at Keighley Creative Space I jumped at it. I find photography can

be extremely cathartic and a great vessel to communicate things we sometimes find hard to talk about. I wanted show how photography has more to offer than selfies and funny animal pictures.

The darkroom is about spreading the

BEHIND THE SCENES AT THE MUSEUM

'CHECKING OUT ME HISTORY': JOHN AGARD



Following an enjoyable visit to the Museum for Emily Brontë's bicentenary celebrations, we are delighted that John Agard, one of the most highly regarded poets in the UK, is returning to Haworth to read his work. He is a unique and energetic force whose poems have featured on the English GCSE syllabus since 2002 and his work has been described as 'a wonderful affirmation of life, in a language that is vital and joyous'. His performances are mesmerising, due in part to his captivating Anglo-Caribbean accent.

John Agard was born in 1949 and grew up in Georgetown, Guyana, then known as British Guiana. His love of language began in school where his favourite subjects were English, French and Latin. Early influences were eclectic: he recalls reading fairytales and Enid Blyton as a child, before discovering the humour of PG Wodehouse and the Mersey Sound poets Adrian Henri, Roger McGough and Brian Patten. He has fond memories of being an altar boy, and his Roman Catholic upbringing is evident in his poems. Another key influence

that affected his love of words was BBC cricket commentary. In a 2013 newspaper interview, he recalled how 'In the same way that a young teenager today may dream about becoming a rapper, I used to love pretending to be a cricket commentator, like John Arlott. That's when it all came together.' He began his career as a teacher, and went on to work as a librarian, then a feature writer for the Guyana Sunday Chronicle, before moving to England in 1977, with his wife, the poet Grace Nichols.

Agard's poetry concerns itself with cultural differences and class divisions and he enjoys subverting racial stereotypes. He writes for adults and children, using humour and satire to great effect. His poem Half-Caste, which has been on the GCSE syllabus for a number of years, is one such example of this. The poem cleverly challenges the reader to consider the term "half-caste" and its associations with inferiority: "Consequently when I dream / I dream half-a-dream / an when moon begin to glow / I half-caste human being / cast half-a-shadow".

Humour is vital according to Agard, because it 'breaks down boundaries, it topples our self-importance, it connects people, and because it engages and entertains, it ultimately enlightens.' We can't wait to being engaged, entertained, and enlightened in equal measure by John Agard on November 2, so don't miss this opportunity to witness one of the UK's most mesmeric performers.




