

"We've felt really welcomed by the other traders and residents who have been in to try our menu and give us feedback," said Carly.

Jon settled on local Ilkley butcher Lishman's for the supply of meat to the cafe. "We have incorporated their champion sausages in our

breakfast menu and customers tell us they are delighted. We also make our own burgers. and serve proper handmade chips."

Carly is a vegetatian, so the veggie options are substantial at The Fat Bunny. "We do a full veggie breakfast and we have veggie ham, chicken, even veggie THE (beautiful) FAT BUNNY bacon and also soya milk for

coffee." Changing daily specials add value and interest to the menu.

Upstairs, on the second floor is a child friendly family room with a play area, baby changing facilities, comfortable seating for feeding babies, and a loo. Parents can leave their pushchairs on the ground floor in a storage space.

The first floor is furnished with lounge chairs and coffee tables and is mainly child free. "The two different environments allow us to cater to a wider group of customers, welcoming all from the community."

Little touches like the puzzle and fun fact books left for visitors to amuse themselves give the Fat Bunny a playful edge.

Wednesday evenings and run various themed events, for example, 'Rock and a Roll' night, serving butties, milk shakes, and specialty hot chocolates while providing a place for the kids to socialise." BEHIND THE SCENES AT THE MUSEUM



February sees the opening of Mansions in the Sky, a brand new exhibition curated by poet Simon Armitage, our 2017 Creative Partner. Simon is working with the museum team on a number of projects to mark Branwell Brönte's bicentenary. Here he is to tell us more.

Tell us a little about vourself:

I'm a poet and writer, born and living in West Yorkshire.

What most interests you about Branwell?

He's usually depicted as the bad boy of the Bronte clan, a sort of black sheep among the angelic sisters. And certainly his behaviour was pretty erratic at times, and some of his decision-making a bit wayward. But more than anything I sense his disappointment. He was the great hope of the family initially, singled out by his father for special treatment as the son and heir. It seems as if over time Branwell's great ambitions, and the ambitions other people had for him, were overtaken by the

reality of the situation, and that his boyish enthusiasm couldn't be converted into genuine talent, either as a writer or artist. It's from then onward that he begins his slow downward spiral.

What is your favourite item in the **Museum's collection?**

Branwell's wallet. It's a big chunky, meaty thing, like a piece removed from his torso. It's empty, of course – he was never one for saving!

And your favourite piece of Brontë writing?


I'm going to betray Branwell here, but all three sisters were, in the end, far better writers. It's hard to see past Wuthering Heights, if you have a heart and a soul. Some of Emily's poems as well - she had a natural gift. This poem, for example, which revels mischievously in the darker aspects of life :

Fall, leaves, fall; die, flowers, away; Lengthen night and shorten day; Every leaf speaks bliss to me

Fluttering from the autumn tree. I shall smile when wreaths of snow Blossom where the rose should grow; I shall sing when night's decay Ushers in a drearier day.

Anything else you'd like to tell us?

Come and see the exhibition at the Museum. I think many people have a neat and tidy image of the Brontes and their world, but this will be like walking into Branwell's head - not a pretty place.

Keighley & Worth Valley Railway Events 2017



The alarm goes off just after 6:30 and it's not even a working day. By 8:15 I'm taken back to 1910 [that's the year, not the time!] and am unlocking the gates at Oakworth station. It's foggy, so I put the signal and gate lights on, and then make sure the fires are lit in the booking office and waiting room. There's no electric lighting at the station, so I illuminate some of the gas lamps to help me see the train register that I need to complete during the day to record the passing of trains.

Pushing the station barrows on to the



platform brings the place to life. I ring the telegraph bell down to the signal

box at Damems Junction to let them know that I'm on duty and ready to operate the crossing gates and signals when the first train arrives just after 9. At 905 the 'treddle' just past Haworth station is depressed, ringing the bell at Oakworth to alert me to the imminent arrival of the heritage diesel. I put the gates across the road, having my first Mr Perks moment of the day, and operate the levers to raise the signal and the train arrives, dropping off and collecting the first passengers of the day. The train leaves and I ring down to the signal box to let them know the train is en route.

Then peace returns, giving me time to put the kettle on and wait for the train to return from Keighley. The peace is short-lived, however, because the train approach bell sounds again and a work train arrives from Haworth, and shunts the yard to take the ballast wagon down to Ingrow later in the day.

And so begins the routine of the day... half an hour between trains to fettle the station, polishing the brass and stoking the fires (and keep the kettle boiling for the benefit of fellow volunteers!), operating the gates and signals, and welcoming passengers. The last train passes in the twilight of a winter late afternoon, just after the gas lights on the platform have lit, which brings a fantastic glow to the station.

I started many years ago as a volunteer trainee booking clerk and received full training and examination to achieve the crossing keeper qualification, which permits me to run Oakworth and Damems stations, and you can do the same by applying via the website for this or the variety of roles that we have on offer.

If you prefer to visit as a passenger, there's a whole variety of events planned for 2017, with the visit of **Flying Scotsman in early April**, seats for which are selling very fast with many trains already full, so please do book soon to avoid disappointment. We also continue to run trains every weekend and daily in half term, with our **Steam Gala in early March**, and a visit from **Sid and Scrat from Ice Age 21/22 February**.

West Lane Baptist Church...where all are welcome and none are turned away!



On the 15th January 2017. churches across the world celebrated the civil rights activist Rev'd Martin Luther King, who gave his life for his dream of a world where people are not judged by the colour of their

skin but by the content of their character. At West Lane Baptist Church in Haworth (WLBC), this day marked a significant point in a similar vein – as it was the day we voted in favour of registering our building for the 'solemnization of marriages of same sex couples' (SSM).

I'm Nick. and I've been the Minister in Training at WLBC for over a year, and during this time we have all been on guite a journey as a church. In July 2016, a meeting took place at WLBC to discuss a statement from the Baptist Union of Great Britain (our governing body) regarding SSM. At this meeting we talked about our principles as Baptists, and what we stood for as a church.

Although a relatively small congregation, WLBC have formed their identity around serving the community in every way possible. The church, along with the minister Rev. Chris Upton, is always eager to establish that all are welcome to come and take part in all that we do. We also believe that God's love makes no exceptions and so it was these values that played a key role in our thinking as a church. A question that we asked ourselves was. "What obstacles may be preventing us from living out God's message of welcome and love in our community?"

After a further two church meetings and sensing we had dedicated a healthy amount of time and space for everyone to consider the matter, we agreed that a vote would take place in January, and the outcome was overwhelmingly in favour of the church registering for SSM. At the morning service before the vote took place, we focussed on Martin Luther King's words: "How often the church has been an echo rather than a voice, a tail-light rather than a headlight..." We are acutely aware that the church is still all too often a tail-light to society, following where it should be leading, however I feel genuinely privileged to be a part of a church that is seeking to be proactive in being a light in our community.

We look forward to holding same sex marriages in the near future. All are welcome, none are turned away!

Farming, tourism and job creation targeted by new £1.2 million fund The South Pennines Leader programme has a budget of £1,286,000 available to help support a range of business enterprises in the South Pennines. Applications are now being accepted for the programme, which runs until 2019 and is managed by rural regeneration company Pennine Prospects.

"The new Leader programme is designed to support projects that create jobs and promote economic growth," explained Candy Squire-Watt, Leader Programme Coordinator. "We are keen to hear from farmers and business owners who may have an idea for diversification or expansion. This is capital funding for the purchase of specialist equipment or for buildings and unlike some other regions with Leader funding we haven't put a cap on individual funding applications."

The programme is designed to offer support to increase farm productivity, as well as support for micro and small enterprises and farm diversification, rural

tourism, the provision of rural services, support for cultural and heritage activity and for increasing forestry productivity. Grants will be awarded for 40% of the full cost of a project. There is a handbook and guidance notes available from the South Pennines Leader website at www.southpenninesleader.co.uk 07563 159536.

"There are so many different businesses in the South Pennines that could benefit from this funding," explained Candy. "For example, we'd like to hear from you if you have a farm or forestry business delivering visitor services, developing new local products or contributing to the landscape. Maybe you run a visitor-facing business that provides distinctive visitor services such as accommodation or local food and drink. If so, you may be eligible for this funding.

"If you have an idea please call and we can discuss it. We can offer advice and guidance and check for eligibility to ensure you get the best chance of success."

The Leader funding is designed to promote local productivity in the South Pennines and as such can be accessed by many different types of businesses and organisations. Manufacturers creating or processing distinctive locally derived products that promote the South Pennines may be eligible to apply, as may designer-maker businesses creating locally distinctive products with associated retailing, workshops, courses and visitor products. Recreational businesses structuring their business around the local landscape and its recreational opportunities, and social enterprises delivering local community services may also be eligible.


