



WELCOME BACK TO THE BRONTË PARSONAGE MUSEUM

We were delighted to throw open the doors of the Parsonage once more on Friday 28 August and welcome back our first visitors. Being able to do so was the result of weeks of intensive work: poring over Government guidelines and risk assessments; commissioning and installing protective screens, hand sanitising stations and new signage; implementing online booking and timed ticketing and then sharing all of this with our staff and volunteers through a series of training days.

So what can you expect when you visit? Some things have changed, but other things, such as a warm welcome and informative and inspiring displays, haven't.

The biggest change is that admission is now by pre-booked timed ticket only – even for those who live nearby!

Those of you familiar with the Museum will know that it is an intimate, historic

building with our collections displayed in a number of small rooms. It's therefore very important that we control numbers and facilitate social distancing. Our online booking system also supports the NHS Test and Trace service by collecting the names and details of visitors.

Booking is via the Visit Us page of our website. You will be directed to Art Tickets and will be asked to select a date and time and type of ticket. If you still have a Worth Valley Mag 'Let me in, I'm local!' voucher to redeem,

you will find these in the Free and Promotional Tickets list. Your ticket is then emailed to you and you can print it out before your visit or download it to a mobile device.

Our staff are all wearing visors or facemasks and visitors are also required to wear face coverings. We have set up a one-way route through the museum and surfaces are cleaned at regular intervals during the day.

Museum is and screens have been installed at the cash desk and in the shop. Contactless payments are preferred, but we will accept cash where this is not possible.

Sarah Goodenough was one of our first visitors of our reopening weekend and shared this with us:

"It was so good to be back at the Museum. I felt very welcomed and safe and the museum staff did a wonderful

job of making me feel at ease. I felt like I had the Parsonage to myself due to the small groups allowed in at allocated times. Thank you to everyone involved for making the experience truly great despite such difficult times."

Stanbury Cricket

A cricket club, in Stanbury? You're pulling my leg.

The first mention of a local cricket club is of that at Ponden, in 1873. The club, which played non-competitive matches could have been - at least in part - a team consisting of some of the 300 or so workers & their families living in makeshift accommodation at the local reservoirs at Ponden and Watersheddles, which were in the process of being constructed.

The Stanbury club played non-competitive matches between 1874-96. This side was linked to the Ponden club, borne out by the fact that several of the Ponden team went on to play for Stanbury. The club's star player was one | Williamson, and this could well have been John Williamson, or a relative of his. Williamson was known to have been the occupier - as a worsted spinner - of Ponden Mill, in the 1850s, and also operated Griffe Mill a little further down the valley by the time the cricket club had emerged on the scene.

Although the Stanbury club was not among the leading teams in the district, and for some of those years did not field a team at all, it was well-known around the Worth Valley. In 1896 the club was known as Stanbury Albion before disappearing completely.

In August 1885 the club's home wicket was described as 'dangerous' in the local press, following a match against Oakworth Albion. The location of the cricket pitch in the village is unknown - there was a ground close to Haworth at 'Long Bridge', below Oldfield Gate, that was once used by Haworth Cricket Club, but it is more likely that a field in or close to Stanbury itself was used. A field off Back Lane, close to the junction with the lane to Buckley Green, and which was once used as a rifle range is one possibility.

There was another, short-lived and even more minor cricket club in the vicinity, that of the Wright Brothers Employees. This was a team representing Lumbfoot Mill. A number of matches against local opposition in 1895 have been traced. The club may have used the same untraced ground used by the Stanbury team, although there are other flat fields closer to the old mill that may well have served their purpose.

Please don't put it off any longer

Without an LPA, any joint bank accounts you hold with your partner could become severely restricted. This can be devastating, especially if the joint owner has their income or pension paid into this account, or they use it to pay critical bills such as a mortgage or utility costs.

What is a Living Trust?


A Living Trust bypasses the time-consuming process of probate. You can place your assets in a Trust to make sure your beneficiaries receive them at a time that's right for you and for them. You have complete control – you decide on the trustees and what they can and cannot do. 

Golden Autumnal Hues by Lee Senior

Autumn arrives in our gardens this month and with it comes one of nature's finest displays. Very little in nature can beat this grand finale of stunning, fiery leaf colour just before the trees shed their foliage for winter.

The fallen, spent leaves are great for making leaf mould too. This very useful soil improver is created by simply gathering fallen deciduous leaves and leaving them for a year to rot down. They can be put in bags or simply left out in the open. Don't be tempted to add the leaves to a compost bin as they rot down much slower than normal

garden material.
The so-called dormant period between now and the end of March is the ideal time to plant bare-rooted trees or fruit bushes. The advantage of trees in containers is they can be planted

all year round. If you

are ordering by mail order it is important to unpack the trees straight away as they will have very little fibrous root. Give them a good soak before planting them in their final positions.

Overwintered Onion sets and garlic can be planted this month. Garlic enjoys rather cold winter weather and the longer growing season given by Autumn planting. October and November are the busiest months of the year for bulb planting. No matter what the size of your garden there is a vast choice of both dwarf and larger daffodil varieties. Dwarf types will even grow in a deep window box, along with a

smattering of crocus and snowdrops. Indoors, specially prepared or 'forced' hyacinth bulbs can be planted now in a bowl for flowering in December. The heady scents of these fine bulbs are sure to brighten any room during the darker months.

The 'forced' bulbs have been heat treated to flower earlier than garden hyacinths which flower outdoors in April. To get a good root system it is a good idea to let the bulbs spend the first couple of weeks in the dark. Once roots form, they need a cool, well- light room or a frost-free

unheated greenhouse.
After flowering the bulbs can be planted out in the garden and should flower outdoors in future years.
Finally, why not plant out a few winter bedding plants in key areas. Favourites such as polyanthus, primroses

and winter flowering pansies will not fail to disappoint. They will flower throughout the milder spells of winter and early next spring. Something we can all look forward to!

Many of you will have heard of Haworth referred to as the lewel in Bradford's Crown. Here in Haworth we know we have many jewels but the one I'm talking about is

our beautiful Haworth Central Park. Old photos of Haworth show the Old Board School on Butt Lane adjoining a field belonging to The Emmott Rawdon Estate. This field, after a lot of haggling, was finally sold to Haworth Urban District Council on 17th November 1926 and the park was born. It was officially opened in May 1929. The tennis courts were opened in 1928. The Bowling Green and Pavillion were officially opened on May 12th 1937 Coronation Day for George 6th.

In those days there were railings around the park with gates that were locked at sunset and opened again 7.30 am. There was also a Park Keeper and regular gardening staff. The railings and gates vanished during the war years.

The original bandstand was built around 1928 with the Bradford Working Men's Club the first concert to be enjoyed on June 30th 1929. Haworth Band was formed around 1860 but struggling to survive having lost their patron when Merrill's Mill went in to receivership. This Bandstand disappeared in the early to mid 70's as the roof had become unsafe. It was supposedly taken to be repaired, but was never seen again. In 2006, The Friends of the Park group was formed our first project being to replace the Bandstand. It took many years of serious fundraising and planning to complete.

Haworth Band couldn't wait to get playing on it and held their first concert on the newly finished base open to the elements. It rained of course but everyone who attended had a great time. The final opening by The Lord Mayor of Bradford cllr. Mike Gibbons was held in the summer 2013 a glorious summer day with a picnicking audience who were treated to an afternoon and evening of local talent of various genres showing the versatility of the new stage. The current Friends group works hard in partnership with the Parks dept. to help keep the Park glorious as osterity cuts were destined to deplete flowerbeds and general upkeep. Because of our strong Friends Group we have a community voice that Bradford listens to. ~ Gill Hill

Easy Apple and Cinnamon Traybake

My friend brought me a bag of apples from a neighbour's orchard; it seems to be a good healthy crop this year. This recipe is best made with Bramley or other baking apple varieties. It is ever so easy...why not make it with the kids after school one day? The smell of apple and cinnamon wafting from the oven is guaranteed to put everyone in a good mood. This simple traybake can be elevated to a pudding when served warm with cream or custard.

Ingredients:

250 g butter softened 250 g light muscovado sugar 4 large eggs I tbsp ground cinnamon 500 g apples peeled cored and diced 300 g self-raising flour 2 tbsp demerara sugar (optional)

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180C, gas mark 4. Grease and line a rectangular baking tin about 23 x 27cm.



Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time beating well after each addition. Beat in the cinnamon, then add the apples and mix well.

Gently fold in the flour until well combined. Spoon into the prepared tin and spread level. Sprinkle over the demerara sugar.

Bake in the centre of the oven for 45 minutes, until risen and golden. The cake will spring back when gently pressed in the centre with your finger. Allow to cool in the tin. Transfer to a board and cut into squares to serve.


