WORTH VALLEY WARBLER

(INTRODUCING THE BIRDMAN FROM HAWORTH)

Welcome to this new feature. We will be taking a light-hearted look at some of the birds you may see in the Worth Valley, either in your garden or out and about in our local countryside. We will highlight some of the more interesting aspects of the common birds who are around all year (that we otherwise take for granted) as well as some of the more "exotic" migrants who either pass through to breeding grounds elsewhere – or chose to raise a family here in the spring.

February is generally a quiet month, though the garden bird table can be a lively place as winter berry supplies become exhausted and freezing conditions make everyday a survival challenge for many birds.

A bird you can be pretty much guarantee to see anywhere is the wren. One of our smallest and commonest garden visitors its very independent of us.. Solitary and "anti-social" its almost mouse like as it creeps under hedges in gardens, yet is equally at home amongst the cracks and crevices in the stone walls of the exposed moors. However, for all its tough independence, it is extremely susceptible to long cold winter nights and large numbers can be lost in harsh winters. One of the most striking aspects of its behaviour is its survival tactics for keeping warm. Wrens will gather together at dusk in communal roosts and cram together in groups to keep warm – a bit like the penguins in the Antarctic. Sometimes this

can involve large numbers in impossibly small spaces. At its extreme - 12 birds have been reported in a coconut shell and the record is over 50 in a nest box! Amazing when you consider how anti-social they are. **Out and about** – Look out for Dippers on the River Worth and Bridgehouse Beck. A remarkable species of fast-flowing upland streams. You cannot mistake them. Like a giant barrel-chested wren they are dark with a brilliant white chest. Watch them bobbing up and down on a boulder and then plunging into the icy waters, walking on the river bed (against the current!) in search of aquatic invertebrates.

WINED & DINED

I have to admit that for me one of the most tiresome tasks is the occasional necessity of engaging in

the skirmish of the supermarket aisle; negotiating trollies bristling with copious amounts of plastic food, languishing in plastic boxes or shrink wrapped plastic packaging is not my idea of fun. Give me small, specialist local food shops or farmers markets where a wealth of seasonal treasures lay waiting to be harvested by the discerning gastronome and I am in food heaven. A weekly visit to the food monoliths cannot come close to the sheer joy of selecting the food that you feel inspired to eat rather than settling for a meal pre-ordained by the looming sell by dates scrawled menacingly across your supermarket shop.

Fast food doesn't have to come out of a box, be bland and insipid or be harmful to your health. With a few basics in your store cupboard to which you need only add two or three fresh ingredients gathered during your lunch hour or on the way home, you can drum up a delicious supper in the time it takes to warm up a ready meal.

At present my own storecupboard houses a few dried items – amongst them arborio rice, pasta, organic red and green lentils, haricot and flageolet beans; other bits and pieces such as tinned tomato's, oils, groundnut, chilli, walnut, organic olive, etc; balsamic, cider and a gorgeous earthy fig vinegar. I have a stock

of preserves, mostly homemade but not all of them my own (I am lucky enough to have jam making friends to whom I am hugely indebted for their delectable gifts of jams, jellies and chutneys) There are a few large crisp onions with pearly amber skins, organic garlic, a bowl brimful with large brown farm eggs and some lovely organic tomato's, firm, fleshy and rich ruby red; half a dozen aromatic yellow lemons, tangy goats cheese and an ivory gruyere, meltingly full-flavoured and satisfying. I always keep herbs, both fresh and dried, which I use both medicinally and in my cooking.

By picking up a baguette or a bloomer, a few crisp salad leaves and a couple of glossy sweet red peppers to roast with my tomato's I could prepare a light supper of roasted red pepper and goats cheese crostini with green salad in just over half an hour. Stips of succulent roasted pepper and tomato, fresh basil, a drizzle of oil and seasoning, arranged on slices of toasted crusty bread, topped with the goats cheese and grilled until melting and creamy, served with a green salad and a dollop of spicy tomato chutney – simple, nutritious and mouth-wateringly delicious. If you don't like goats cheese you could change it for something you do like. The same applies to all the ingredients; you can custom build a crostini to your own taste.

The pleasure derived from this form of eating stems, not only from gathering, preparing and consuming the fruits of your own labour, but from the satisfaction of knowing that what you have just eaten was not only gorgeous but good for you too.

Tucked away in an unlikely location in Keighley is a little gem of a restaurant called Orient. You will feel distinctively proud to have found the place to begin with; (It is next door to the Keighley Bus depot!) but don't let that put you off, the feeling will turn to sheer delight once inside its calm and attractive interior. It is an oasis that will continue to delight and offer you a sumptuous dining experience.

Highly recommended is the aromatic crispy lamb, an interesting twist on the traditional crispy duck recipe, it is served with slivers of spring onions, cucumber, hoi-sin sauce and wafer thin pancakes.

Moving on to the main course the choice is daunting yet delectable with Szechuan, Satay, Bo Bo, Black Bean, Sweet & Sour, O.K. Pineapple & Ginger, Chinese Curry, Ginger and Spring Onion, or Roast Duckling options.

You will find that most of the dishes

can be tempered to your tastebuds as the chef is pleased to add or take away ingredients to suit your preference.

The Orient is open Tuesday to Thursday from 5 - 10:45, Fri - Sat 5 - 11:30. Fri. Business Lunch is served 12noon - 2 Sunday 2 - 9:30. The restaurant is closed Mondays except bank holidays.

February 7th is Chinese New Year and a perfect opportunity to experience a taste of the Orient. Valentines Day is another reason to make your reservation. A cosy dinner for two might be just the ticket.

Is Chris Upton a Man with a mission, a Nice chap with good intentions or is he "Uptonogood"? Whether campaigning to "Make Poverty History", hosting a myriad of Fairtrade events, or organising a local litterpick, Chris certainly isn't shy about wading in and getting his hands dirty.

I wouldn't describe Chris as a do-gooder, that has connotations of a blinded naive approach to life viewed through rose coloured spectacles. On the contrary, Chris is a person who questions things and strives to understand the whys and wherefores of social injustice and inequality; he will be the first to admit he doesn't have all the answers. He likes to debate and grapple with things and simply get on with living his life wide awake and engaged with those around him.

You most likely will encounter Chris out and about in the Worth Valley walking on the street or riding his bicycle. (I don't think I have ever seen him in a car.) Chris' "day" job is Minister of West Lane Baptist Church in Haworth. He arrived as a student in 2000 and was ordained in 2004. He is married to Rachel and they have two daughters, Ella and Molly.

Not wanting to grow stale or complacent, (as if?), in 2006 Chris masterminded a

ministerial "swap" with another minister in New Zealand. "I thought it would give West Lane a break from me...and of course they were happy to oblige...they must have relished the thought of a year without me!"

The swap included the whole family so it was initially quite an upheaval, both scary and exciting at the same time.

"We lived in Dunedin, New Zealand's first and oldest city. It has a population of 120,000, quite a bit larger than Haworth, but it still felt like a village."

Chris explained that he learned to surf, drank lousy beer called Speights (he joked, "brewed for those with no mates!") and he couldn't get over the amount of meat pies consumed by the locals. "We got to participate in Kiwi life first hand. The kids enrolled in the local school and I got stuck in to doing pretty much similar things to what I was doing here in Haworth; visiting people, taking services, getting involved in pastoral life, and joining the local Fairtrade group. I even bought a bike for £3 and managed to get around in my usual way."

"Yes there were cultural differences ...but people are people no matter where you encounter them; it was still about building relationships and getting involved in the local community in a meaningful way."

"My year in Dunedin, gave me an insight into another country's awareness of Fairtrade. New Zealand has a unique history and relationship to the developing world, but it has not had time to develop a vast array of charities, agencies, and non-government organisations. The one notable home grown organisation is "Trade Aid". Their website www.tradeaid.org.nz speaks about how it all came about:

More than 30 years ago a young Christchurch couple went looking for adventure. They had no idea that their drive and vision would lead to the founding of an aid organisation unique in New Zealand.

It was in 1969, when Vi and Richard Cottrell were in their early 30s, that they saw an advertisement for an adviser to a resettlement scheme for Tibetan refugees in northern India. They applied and were sent a cable that read simply: "proceed to India"

A fledgling carpet export business had been set up to create an income for the refugees and it was Vi's job to find foreign buyers, while her Tibetan counterpart dealt with the weavers. When the Cottrells returned to New Zealand they wanted to go on supporting the Tibetan refugees. They ordered \$1000 worth of carpets that they displayed in the CSA Gallery in Christchurch. Within 15 minutes of opening, all the carpets were sold.

"With Trade Aid being firmly established in the minds of New Zealanders it is easy to see why they equate the Fairtrade Foundation with Trade Aid. In Dunedin I worked with the local Fairtrade group in pushing for their city to become the 1st Fairtrade city in the country, and a large part of their work was communicating the broader scope of the Fairtrade Foundation on the global stage and clarifying and differentiating Fairtrade as a separate entity to Trade Aid."

"I am pleased to see that Trade Aid's website has the film **Black Gold** on its homepage, as Haworth West Lane Baptist Church will be showing this film on Sunday March 2nd at 6pm, as part of this year's Fairtrade Fortnight celebrations."

The promotion reads:

*"Wake up and smell the coffee.
Your coffee will never
taste the same again."*

"I do not know whether Dunedin will be NZ's 1st Fairtrade city, but I do know that every cup of Fairtrade coffee that is drunk in Dunedin, NZ or in the Worth Valley, UK, is more likely to give a better deal to the 3rd world producers and farmers than ever before."



We recently met Gail Steward, medical herbalist and proprietor of the newly opened Haworth Organic Products Store, or "HOPS" as it is known, located at 73 Main Street. Gail was keen to talk about her passion for organic food and her vision for HOPS to be established as a place for local people.

Q. Tell us about yourself Gail, including your background and what led you to open HOPS?

A. I initially trained and worked as a nurse in the NHS. But I became frustrated with the system and started to look at natural approaches to health. It was a logical progression for me to become a medical herbalist.

I also began to recognise the importance of good food in relation to good health and its role in building, repairing, and healing the body.

What led me to open HOPS was a desire to use my skills and knowledge within the community and provide a service and product range that wasn't currently available.

Q. It sounds like the organic aspect of your shop is important to you, why is that?

A. The organic aspect IS crucial because it is important to get the most nutrients out of our food in its whole and natural state. I also equate organic with fair because the environment is not harmed or intensively managed.

Q. What do you sell at HOPS?

A. We are willing to stock most things if our customers request it. We sell eggs, milk, butter

and bread; also dry goods like flour, sugar, grains, pastas, spices, herbal teas. We have an excellent range of jams, cordials, juices, vegetarian pastes, patés, condiments, nuts, seeds, dried fruits, the list too numerous to rattle off! In the back of the shop there is skincare, vitamins and supplements, herbal tonics, tinctures, natural healthcare products and books. Most weekends we offer fresh food.

Q. What about fresh organic fruit and vegetables?

A. We have a box scheme. Orders are placed by Monday 5pm for pick up Wednesday afternoon. We are happy to make deliveries within the area for an extra pound. Prices start at £7 for a small box of 7 basic vegetables. Mixed fruit and veg boxes start at £13. The boxes are stocked with seasonal fruit and veg grown in Yorkshire when

possible or sourced from other farms in the UK. Some fruits like bananas, oranges, kiwis, etc. come from other countries.

Q. When are you open?

A. Wednesday through Sunday 11am-5pm but ring the doorbell at other times and we will be pleased to serve you!
